17	Webster, Tex. Left Hulen Park 8.24 a. m.; arrived at Webster 12.10 p. m.; distance marched, 9 miles.
18	Dumont, Tex. Left Webster 7.17 a. m.; arrived at Dumont 12.05 p. m.; distance marched, 13½ miles.
