All that kind of stuff, you run, miles.

Done night problems.

Then you go out and shooting range.

Which fired rifles, shooting guns, mortars.

They shipped us off the.

France. That's when the war was going on.

We talked to Germans, we talked to France and we talked to.

It was.

About like we are around here.

But it's hard to understand them. You got to.

Kind of learn.

And I've called one hands and one with Fritz. Their boys. They clean up my stuff and clean my room.

And one that was Christmas time. And one day I come back from driving by driving a semi semi but it's.

Yeah, truck hold rations. I come home that night and then little boys had me a Christmas tree set up.

A lot of members of them, little boy, but I wouldn't be.

And I'd get them stuff to eat out the kitchen, yeah.

Yeah. And that kind of made you think about going home?

I don't think anybody over there could say they would never scared.

Sometimes you do things when you're scared.

That you wouldn't do otherwise.

Oh, that's about the best way to have some laugh.

I've seen the dead horse and then our people dead.

Then they start thinking about.

How it would be if she wasn't up till next morning?

Whenever you're out there in battle and.

Dealing with everything that happened out there.

My dad was in World War 1.

I've got the the the back one they called.

I guess I never thought too much about it.

My right age and.

I hope that sometime your days don't come in there like that.

It was kind of like on a raft.

All rest vacation few days off.

We stand in the house.

The way we are, we already took over houses.

00:17:00 Speaker 2

And this House is in that time there was some young gal down there.

Like I'm saying all them gals, you know, she was probably.

But like 14 channel bicycle.

That was broke.

00:17:18 Speaker 1

Yeah.

00:17:20 Speaker 2

I don't remember what I've done, but.

I got my tools that I can find and I fixed her bicycle for.

So them people.
